**PART 1**

**GENERAL REGULATIONS**

**§15-101. Definitions and Interpretation.**

1. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, except for Sections or Parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in The Vehicle Code (the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162 No. 81), as amended, except that, in this Chapter, the word “street” may be used interchangeably with the word “highway”, and shall have the same meaning as the word “highway” as defined in the Vehicle Code.
2. The term “legal holidays” as used in this Chapter shall mean and include: New Year’s Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
3. In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

**§15-102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.**

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as Chapters, as parts of Chapters, as amendments to Chapters, or as amendments to this chapter, except where the law specifically authorizes less formal action.

**§15-103. Provisions to be Continuation of Existing Regulations.**

The provisions of this Chapter, so far as they are the same as those of Chapters and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Chapter, are intended as a continuation of those earlier Chapters and regulations, and not as new enactments. Nothing in this Chapter shall affect any act done or liability incurred, or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any of those repealed or superseded Chapters or regulations.

## MOTOR VEHICLES

### **§15-104. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.**

1. The Chief of Police shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency.
  - A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations; and
  - B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
2. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or making erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100.

### **§15-105. Experimental Regulations.**

The Board of Supervisors may, from time to time by resolution, designate places upon and along the highways in the Township where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective as if they had been specified in this Chapter. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or make by authority of this Part. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100 provided, the purpose of this Section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Township relative to traffic and parking.

### **§15-106. Traffic on Streets Closed or Restricted for Construction, Maintenance or Special Events.**

1. The Board of Supervisors shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.

2. The Board of Supervisors shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.
3. Any person who violates any provision of this Part shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100.

**§15-107. Use of Streets by Processions and Assemblages.**

1. For the purpose of this §15-107, the words “assemblage” and “procession” shall have the following meanings:

ASSEMBLAGE — a gathering of people without vehicles, which interferes with the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on any street.

PROCESSION — a group of individuals, vehicles, animals and/or objects moving along a street in a way that interferes with the normal movement of traffic. A procession shall not include a funeral caravan or military convoy.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless the person organizing or conducting the assemblage first obtains a permit from the Township Secretary, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least one week in advance of the day on which the assemblage is proposed to be held, but in any case where a state-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least three weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall state the place where and the date when the assemblage is to be held, the hour when the assemblage may convene and the hour by which it shall have been completely dispersed. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any assemblage unless the permit has been granted, or at any time or place other than that authorized by the permit.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any procession unless the person organizing or conducting the procession first obtains a permit from the Township Secretary, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least two weeks in advance of the day when the procession is proposed to be held, but in any case where a state-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least three weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall specify the date on which the procession is to be held, the route to be followed by the procession, the hour when and place where participants may commence to assemble and form before the procession is under way, the time when the procession may commence to move along its route, and the time

by which the end of the procession shall have reached the end of the route of the procession and the procession shall have been disbanded. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any procession unless the permit shall have been granted, or under any conditions as to time or route or otherwise than those stated in the permit.

4. Any person who violates any provision of this Part shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100.

### **§15-108. Authority of Police Officers.**

The police officers of the Township are hereby authorized to direct traffic on the highways of the Township and at intersections thereof and to otherwise enforce the provisions of this Chapter.

### **§15-109. Authorization for Use of Speed Timing Devices.**

1. The Township Police Department is hereby authorized to use all speed timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with Title 75, Pa. C.S.A. §3368.
2. This §15-109 authorizes the use of said devices upon all highways within the Township, be they Township, county or state highways, and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to "local authorities" under the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 75 Pa. C.S.A. §6101 et seq. (1977) as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

**PART 2****TRAFFIC REGULATIONS****§15-201. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Streets.**

1. Maximum speed limits are established on portions of specified streets, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle, on any part of a street where a maximum speed limit applies, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the street:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of \$5 per mile for each mile in excess of five miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

### **§15-202. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Bridges and Elevated Structures.**

1. Maximum speed limits are established, as follows, on certain bridges and elevated structures, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any such bridge or elevated structure, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that bridge or elevated structure:

**§15-203. Maximum Speed Limits Established for Certain Vehicles on Hazardous Grades.**

- The following are declared to be hazardous grades, and, upon any such hazardous grade, no person shall drive a vehicle, having a gross weight in excess of that referred to for that grade, in the direction stated for that grade, at a speed in excess of that established in this §15-203 for that grade, and, if so stated for a particular grade, the driver of every such vehicle shall stop the vehicle before proceeding downhill:

**§15-204. Maximum Speed Limits Established in Parks.**

- A speed limit of 15 miles per hour is established on all streets and roadways in the public parks maintained and operated by the Township, except in the following locations, where the lower maximums, as specified, shall apply:

**§15-205. Traffic Signals at Certain Locations.**

1. At the following locations, traffic signals as indicated below shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected), and traffic at those locations shall be directed by those signals:

**§15-206. Intersections Where Turn Prohibited on Red Signal.**

1. The following are established as intersections where drivers of vehicles headed in the direction or directions indicated are prohibited from making a right turn (or a left turn from a one-way street into another one-way street) on a steady red signal:

**§15-208. Turning at Certain Intersections Prohibited or Restricted.**

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, of the type indicated, traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to make a left turn and/or a right turn into the second-named street, as indicated, at any time when such a turn is prohibited by this §15-208:

**§15-209. Right Turns Only Permitted at Certain Intersections.**

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to make other than a right turn, at any time stated, both left turns and straight-across traffic being prohibited:

**§15-211. No Passing Zones Established.**

1. The following are established as no passing zones, and it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to overtake or pass another vehicle or to drive on the left side of the roadway in any no passing zone:

**§15-212. Through Highways Established.**

1. The following highways are established as through highways, thus authorizing stop or yield signs to be erected facing traffic approaching every intersection with the through highway except for those intersections with traffic signals, or with exceptions or modifications as indicated below. Every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop or yield sign authorized by this §15-212 shall stop the vehicle or yield right-of-way as required by §3323(b) or §3323(c) of the Vehicle Code, as the case may be, and shall not proceed into or across the through highway until he has followed all applicable requirements of that section of the law:

**§15-213. Stop Intersections Established.**

1. The following intersections (in addition to intersections with the through highways established by §15-212) are established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street (the intersecting or through street) on the first-named street (the stop street) in the direction or directions indicated for that intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first named or stop street, in the direction indicated in each case, shall stop the vehicle as required by §3323(b) of the Vehicle Code, and shall not proceed into or across the second-named or intersecting or through street until he has followed all applicable requirements of that section of the law.

Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first-named or yield street, in the direction indicated in each case, shall slow down or stop the vehicle as required by §3323(c) of the Vehicle Code, and then yield the right-of-way as required by that Subsection of the Vehicle Code.

**PART 3****RESTRICTIONS ON SIZE, WEIGHT AND TYPE OF VEHICLE AND LOAD****§15-301. Vehicle Weight Limits Established on Certain Streets and Bridges.**

### **§15-302. Exemptions for Local Traffic.**

1. Local Traffic. The following shall be regarded as local traffic:
  - A. Emergency vehicles;
  - B. School buses;
  - C. Vehicles and combinations of governmental agencies and utilities or their contractors engaged in construction or maintenance on a posted highway or in a location which can be reached only via a posted highway; and,
  - D. Vehicles and combinations going to or coming from a residence, commercial establishment, or farm located on a posted highway or which can be reached only via a posted highway.
2. General Rule. Over-posted-weight local traffic may exceed posted weight limits unless the posting authority determines that an over-postedweight vehicle or vehicles being driven to or from a particular destination or destinations are likely to damage the highway.
  - A. Vehicles Determined Likely to Damage Highway. If the posting authority determines that one or more over-posted-weight vehicles are likely to damage the highway, the posting authority will so notify the registrants of the over-posted-weight vehicles or owners of the destination or destinations, or both, and will also notify state and local police. After two business days following delivery of the notice, or after five days following mailing of the notice, such over-posted-weight vehicles shall not exceed the posted weight limits except in accordance with the provisions of §15-303 of this title (relating to use under permit).
  - B. Proof of Local Traffic Status. The following types of documents will constitute evidence that a vehicle is local traffic.
    - (1) A bill of lading, shipping order, or similar document which shows a destination on the posted highway.
    - (2) Certification by the permitter or an official of a permittee company on the company letterhead describing the local traffic nature of the activity which the vehicle is engaged in.

### **§15-303. Permits for Over-Posted-Weight Vehicles.**

1. Over-posted-weight vehicles may be permitted to use Township streets posted by the Township. Permits shall be obtained from Township in accordance with the

Pennsylvania Department of Transportation standards in force and effect at time such application is made.

**§15-401. Vehicles to be Parked Within Marked Spaces.**

Wherever a space is marked off on any street for the parking of an individual vehicle, every vehicle parked there shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding that space, and it shall be a violation of this Part for any person to park a vehicle or allow it to remain parked otherwise.

**§15-403. Special Purpose Parking Zones Established; Parking Otherwise Prohibited.**

1. The following are established as special purpose parking zones, in areas designated by resolution of the Board of Supervisors, and it shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle or to allow it to remain parked or standing, in any such zone, except as specifically provided for in that zone, to permit ready access for fire fighting or emergency vehicles:
  - A. Location.
    - (1) Any school within the limits of the Township.
    - (2) St. Barnabas.
    - (3) Richland Mall.
    - (4) Northtowne Square Mall.
2. The Richland Township Police Department shall be authorized to issue parking violation notices or citations for violation of the fire lane section.
3. Any designated “fire separation lane” in future development shall be classified as fire lanes/special purpose parking zones.

**§15-404. Standing or Parking on Roadway for Loading or Unloading.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to stop, stand or park a vehicle (other than a pedal-cycle) on the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of any street, except that standing or parking for the purpose of loading or unloading persons or property shall be permitted on the following named streets on Monday through Saturday, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. and between the hours of 1:30 p.m. and 4:00 p.m., and for no longer than necessary for the loading or unloading.

**§15-408. Parking Prohibited Temporarily in Certain Locations.**

The Chief of Police shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily as follows:

- A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations; and
- B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or social events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
- C. To facilitate the efforts of the Township's Public Works Department in effective and efficient snow and ice removal and to avoid property damage to vehicles during such operations, all parking of vehicles of any type is prohibited from November 1 through April 15 of each snow season on all Township roads and streets.

Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, or who shall move, remove, de-

stroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100.

**REMOVAL AND IMPOUNDMENT OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES**

**§15-501. Applicability and Scope.**

This Part is enacted under authority of §6109(a-22) of the Vehicle Code, and gives authority to the Township to remove and impound those vehicles which are parked in a tow away zone and in violation of parking regulations of this Chapter. Vehicles which have been abandoned (as defined by the Vehicle Code) or which are parked in such a manner as to interfere with traffic or pose a hazard to others, may be towed under the provisions of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

**§15-502. Authority to Remove and Impound.**

The Township shall have authority to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impounding, of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally, provided that the circumstances of its parking were within the conditions stated in §15-501 of this Part. Provided: no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Part, or the provisions of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

**§15-503. Tow-Away Zones Designated.**

The following designated streets and/or parking lots are hereby established as tow-away zones. Signs shall be posted to place the public on notice that their vehicles may be towed for violation of the Township parking regulations:

**§15-504. Designation of Approved Storage Garages; Bonding; Towing and Storage.**

Removal and impounding of vehicles under this Part shall be done only by “approval storage garages” that shall be designated from time to time by the Board of Supervisors. Every such garage shall submit evidence to the Board of Supervisors that is bonded or has acquired liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to the Board of Supervisors

as sufficient to indemnify owners of impounded vehicles against loss or damage to those vehicles while in the custody of the garage keeper for the purpose of towing or storage. The approved storage garage shall submit to the Board of Supervisors its schedule of charges for towing and storage of vehicles under this Part, and, when the schedule is approved by the Board of Supervisors, those charges shall be adhered to by the approved storage garage; no different schedule of charges shall be demanded of or collected from any person whose vehicle is removed or impounded under this Part by any approved storage garage. The Board of Supervisors shall delete from its list of approved storage garages any garage that makes any unapproved charge in connection with any vehicle removed or impounded under this Part.

### **§15-505. Payment of Towing and Storage Charges.**

The payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this Part for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.

### **§15-506. Reclamation Costs.**

In order to reclaim his vehicle, the owner shall pay towing and storage costs, plus a \$100 fee to the Township. In the instance where the Township stores the vehicle at its facility, an additional storage charge of \$25 per day shall accrue after the vehicle has been in storage for 48 hours.

### **§15-507. Records of Vehicles Removed and Impounded.**

The Township shall cause a record to be kept of all vehicles impounded under this Part and shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or the agents of the owners of those vehicles with information as to the place of storage of the vehicle.

### **§15-508. Restrictions upon Removal of Vehicles.**

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this Part or the Vehicle Code if, at the time of the intended removal, the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately.

**§15-509. Penalty for Violation.**

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100, together with all costs of disposing of the vehicle under provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 P.S. 67301 et seq. (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

**§15-510. Reports and Disposition of Unclaimed Vehicles.**

If after a period of 15 days the vehicle in storage remains unclaimed, a report shall be filed with PennDOT in accordance with §7311 of The Vehicle Code, by the person having legal custody of the vehicle. If the vehicle has not been claimed after 30 days, the vehicle may be transferred to a licensed Salvor who will then be responsible for filing the proper reports and disposing of the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 73 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code (75 Pa C.S.A. §110 et seq., as amended).

**PART 6**

**SNOW AND ICE EMERGENCY**

**§15-601. Declaration of Snow and Ice Emergency.**

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named in §15-603 of this Part, the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, in his discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency (designated in this Part as a “snow emergency”). Information on the existence of a snow emergency shall be given by the Township through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

**§15-602. Parking Prohibited, Driving Motor Vehicles Restricted, on Snow Emergency Routes During Emergency.**

After any snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful, at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person:

- A. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated in §15-603 of this Part.
- B. To drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route, unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains.

**§15-604. Penalty for Violation.**

1. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under §15-601 of this Part, a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain

parked anywhere upon a snow emergency route, that person shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100.

2. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under §15-601 of this Part, a person shall drive a motor vehicle upon a snow emergency route without having that vehicle equipped with snow tires or chains, that person shall be civilly liable to the Township in the amount of \$100.

### **§15-605. Notices.**

1. In each instance where a person, firm, corporation or other entity has been charged with a violation of any Section of this Chapter, the Township Secretary, Code Enforcement Officer or police officer shall make a determination of violation and notify the violator by first-class mail or personal service a copy of the civil citation in form adopted by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.
2. The person, firm, corporation or entity cited as a violator may pay the amount of civil liability at a rate of 50% of the amount cited if said payment is made and received by the Township within 10 days of the date of the citation.
3. In the instance of a continuing violation of this Chapter, each day the violation is deemed to continue is, in and of itself, another violation and shall constitute a separate liability in the same amount as originally stated and may be cited as such in the same manner as above set forth.
4. The failure to pay the citation amount of the civil liability by such discount date as stated above shall give cause for the Township by its appropriate official or Solicitor to initiate a civil complaint or complaints against the violator for collection of the civil liability, interest, costs and attorneys fees.
