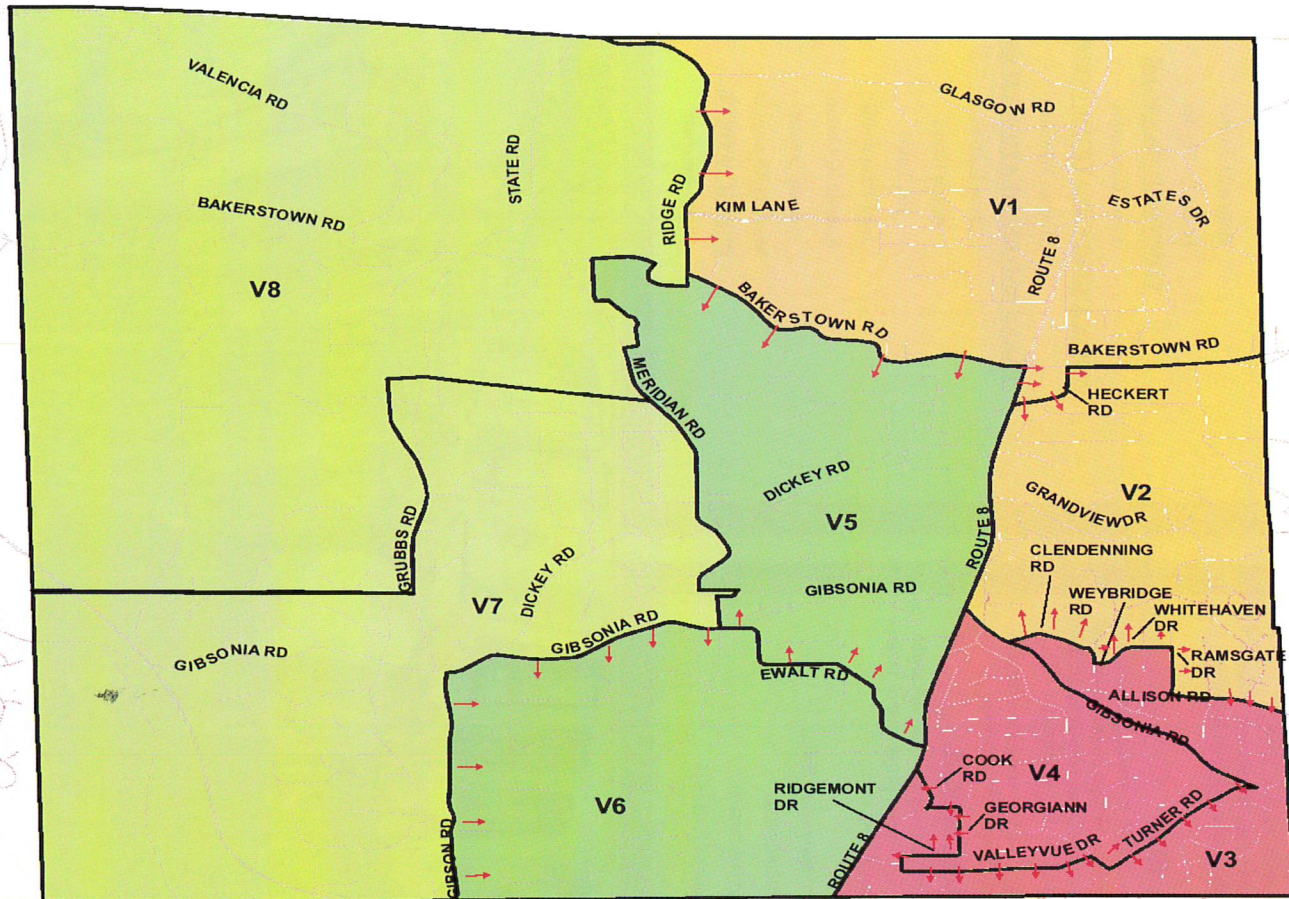


# **RICHLAND TOWNSHIP** **Township Supervisors Districts (4)** **Election Districts (8)** **January 5, 2015**

When the Richland Home Rule Charter was enacted in 1975 it establish a five member Board of Supervisors and created a system providing for the election of four Supervisors by district, of roughly equal population, and one elected at large from the entire Township. The boundaries of the districts have not changed in forty years.

In order to equalize the number of residents in each district and to reduce delays at polling places the Richland Township Board of Supervisors, in conjunction with the Allegheny County Elections Division, filed a Redistricting Petition before the Allegheny County Courts of Common Pleas. The petition was approved on January 5, 2015 and will go into effect for the primary election on Tuesday, May 19, 2015. The new redistricting plan preserves four Supervisor districts and retains eight voting districts. The boundaries of the districts have changed, and for some residents so have their polling locations. The map above identifies the new districts. Prior to the 2015 primary election the Allegheny County Elections Division will mail all registered voters a new certificate identifying the district in which they are located.
